 Nash's use of rhythm and rhyme enhances the storytelling, making it enjoyable and easy to remember, like a song.
- This poem is written by Ogden Nash. The central idea of this poem shows that everything created whether small or big has its specific importance. Usually, we underestimate talented persons but they prove themselves by their wits and right actions. We should never look down on others. Moreover, correct and timely actions are always beneficial. In other words, a stitch in time saves nine, which is also the nucleus of the poem. The Tale of Custard the Dragon" explores themes of bravery and cowardice through the adventures of Belinda and her pets. While Belinda and her other pets show courage when faced with danger, Custard, the dragon, is initially timid. However, when a pirate threatens them, Custard overcomes his fears and displays unexpected bravery, ultimately saving the day despite his initial reluctance.
