- due to the 'fire', which symbolises 'desire' but if the world has to end twice then it will be due to the hatred which is symbolised by 'ice'. The poet feels that there is enough hatred spreading among the people in the world to perish the world twice because unlike fire, ice or hatred affects slowly and gradually and makes the souls of people insensitive to anybody's pain.
- the poem about the end of the world are hypothetical, the poet stresses that the world will either end in fire or in ice.

  Though the poet thinks both ways to be destructive, yet he seems to favour the idea of the destruction of the world in the fire a little more than that of in ice.

- 17. 'Ice' symbolises 'hatred'. Hate is powerful as desire and maybe, more powerful and ferocious than it. While desire consumes quickly, hate can occur and linger in people's minds and hearts for years and sometimes even lifetimes. Hate consumes the hater perhaps even more than the person or group. Thus the hate is sufficient to bring destruction.
- very effectively to convey a definite message to the readers. 'Fire' stands for our uncontrolled passions which are disastrous for human beings. Similarly cold reasoning devoid of human love leads to emotional numbness and indifference. This hatred will lead to the end of this world.
- 19. 'Desire' propels us in hot pursuit of something, hence, it is compared with fire. The lust to fulfil uncontrolled desires traps a person in a bog from where he cannot be saved and hence, demolished in every possible manner. 'Hatred' makes us cold towards others' feelings. The coldness of ice can numb our senses and the coldness of our hearts can numb our kindness.

- Generally, the poetic themes of Frost's 20. poems deal with common topics but his handling of these common topics in an uncommon way is a unique style of Frost. To Frost, the incident is not so important, but he gives importance to its dramatic possibilities. Truth for Frost is not a philosophical concept, but rather a rational observation of facts and their representation. This is the reason why there is so little philosophy in Frost and so much wit and wisdom. The poem Fire and Ice is a symbolic one where Frost has metaphorically used these two words of extreme to represent two contrasting human emotions, i.e, desire and hatred. He depicts how these two emotions are capable of causing damage and immutable destruction of the world leading to its end. The poet leads his reader towards wisdom by giving him some pleasure at the very
