- Ausable's quick thinking helped him outsmart Max. He invented a story about a balcony to explain Max's entry. When Henry, the waiter, knocked, Ausable pretended it was the police, causing Max to panic and escape through the nonexistent balcony. Ausable's presence of mind turned a dangerous situation into a clever victory.
- Ausable. He was the epitome of a suave secret agent, clad in impeccably tailored suits, oozing charisma and confidence. He was slender little less than tall. He appeared crafty and possessed a razor-sharp mind, incredible combat skills, and a knack for extracting vital information covertly, making him an invaluable asset to his agency. There was nothing menacing about him except his pistol.
