In contrast, robbing a careless man is difficult and less satisfying, as he doesn't even notice the theft, depriving the thief of the pleasure and sense of righteousness from the act.

Large hearted Anil not only forgave him but also gave him a fifty rupee note, and promised to pay him regularly. Thus, education is an essential aspect of any child's life and can help enable an honourable way of living.
