Man pollutes the earth by causing death and destruction and by spreading hatred and enmity through wars. War harms both the suppressed and the suppressor. It brings about death, destruction, starvation and pollution. Hence, wars should be stopped forever.

He wants to emphasise that all human beings are identical in nature and the phases of human life are the same anywhere in the world.
- Ways. We eat and drink the things that grow on the Earth. It is Earth we walk and play on and after our lives come to an end, we all lie hidden inside it according to our destiny. While we are alive, we walk on the same Earth and upon our death, we will lie in our graves in the same earth.

The kind Mother Nature becomes absolutely helpless and is unable to shower her gifts on human beings. It is tarnished and robbed of its bounties. The innocence of air, signified by its purity, it striped, away by war and fill it with smoke and dirt. The air then becomes unsuitable for human survival. Thus 'human earth' is 'defiled' and 'innocence of air is 'outraged' by wars..
