- drawing its nourishment from the soil through its roots. The nourishment required by the tree lies deep inside the earth and the root sucks and absorbs nutrients, which help the growth of the tree.
- The real power of a tree lies deep inside the earth's surface i.e. in the roots. The poet, therefore, suggests a complete snapping of these in order to kill a tree. 'the strength of the tree exposed' is used by the poet in this context to signify the situation where the roots of the tree are completely pulled out of the earth and left exposed.
- 17. 'Anchoring earth' refers to the roots of the tree that are deep seated beneath the earth's surface and play the most pivotal role in the healthy growth and nourishment of the tree by supplying it with water and nutrients. "Earth cave" refers to the surface of the ground on which the basic structure of the tree is laid. It performs the significant function of holding the tree and helping it withstand different conditions of natural calamities.

- 18. "On Killing a Tree" is a protest poem, written by Indian poet Gieve Patel in stanzas of irregular length. It does not use the traditional devices of poetry such as rhyme, regular meter, or stanzas of equal length. Instead, it is written in what is called free verse.
- **19.** a. The poem is 'On killing a tree' and the poet is Gieve Patel.
 - After being pulled out, the tree is exposed to sun and air, which scorch and choke it.

 - d. The phrase 'then it is done' means that the soul of the tree is dead and the tree is no more.
- 20. The poem is beautifully written to show us that trees are an important part of our lives and nature is supreme. The poem itself is modelled as a plant growing from the seed. The first line states "It takes much time to kill a tree to tell us that even if humans try to kill a tree it's not easy to do that.

The poet then describes the process of growth of the tree. It is presumed that the tree has grown from its seed and the seed develops the root. The root works its way through the rocks and stones of the soil. The trees grow slowly by feeding upon the earth's crust absorbing years of sunlight, air, and water. The development of the tree takes years and it is because of this slow process of growth that the tree is strong and sturdy and hence it is difficult to kill a tree. A short yet thought-provoking poem.

21. (a)

In the poem, the poet emphasizes that hacking and chopping the tree is not enough to kill it, as the roots remain intact and continue to supply life. The real life of the tree lies in its roots, and unless they are completely removed and exposed, the tree will continue to grow.
