15. An economic sector is a group of economic activities with similar characteristics.
16. Manufacturing clothes / making furniture / processing food.
17. Agriculture is a primary sector activity because it involves direct use of natural resources such as land, water, and crops. Farmers grow grains, vegetables, and fruits from nature. These products form the base for other economic activities.
18. The tertiary sector provides services that help the secondary sector function smoothly. For example, transportation services carry finished goods from factories to markets, making them available to consumers.
19. Economic activities are grouped into three sectors. The primary sector involves extracting raw materials from nature, such as farming, fishing, and mining. The secondary sector processes these raw materials into goods like cloth, furniture, and machines. The tertiary sector provides services such as transport, banking, healthcare, and education that support both production and distribution.
20. The three sectors are closely connected. For example, milk is produced by farmers (primary sector), processed into butter and cheese in factories (secondary sector), and then transported and sold through shops and markets (tertiary sector). Without any one sector, the entire chain would break down.
