- Robert Frost chose the second path as it was less travelled and had perhaps a better claim. The second path was grassy, full of vegetation, and wanted wear. The poet found the second path more promising and challenging.

 Therefore, to set an example by exploring the avenue not traced by anyone in the past, so he decided to opt for the second path.

- Yes, it is appropriate because the title of the poem concerns a choice made between two roads by a person walking in the woods. Such situations are faced by one and all. When one is forced to decide just one option out of the two equally attractive choices. The poet also faced the same situation. The poet finds himself standing in the middle and in a dilemma about which path a take. The woods in this poem symbolize the difficulty of seeing into the future. While walking on a road, he came to the point where the road diverged into two roads. He stood long at the fork, not able to decide as to which of the two roads he should take. He would have liked to explore both the roads, but he knows that he can't walk on both the roads at the same time. He chooses the road not travelled on by too many people and many years later, he feels that all the difference in his life is because of the choice of the road he had made.
