1. What event had the entire class “quaking in its boots”?
- Sports day finals
 - Publication of exam marks in the newspaper
 - Teachers’ meeting to decide promotions
 - Surprise mathematics test (C)

Explanation: The class feared the upcoming meeting where teachers would decide who moved up and who was kept back.

2. Who bet their entire holiday savings on the outcome of the promotions?
- G.N. and Anne

- History

 - Latin (C)

Explanation: Mr. Keesing is the mathematics teacher, described as an “old fogey.”

6. What was the title of the first extra essay assigned as punishment for talking?
- Mistress Chatterbox
 - The Talker’s Tale
 - A Chatterbox
 - Silence Is Golden (C)

Explanation: After several warnings, she was assigned an essay titled “A Chatterbox.”

7. What key argument did she use in her first essay to defend talking?
- Talking helps students learn faster

 - She was preparing for debates (B)

Explanation: She argues that talking is a student’s trait and says inherited traits—like her mother’s talkativeness—are hard to change.

8. What was the title of the third assignment she received for talking again?
- The Chatterbox Returns

 - An Unstoppable Talker
 - Ducks and Swans (B)

Explanation: After a second essay, she was told to write “Quack, Quack, Quack, Said Mistress Chatterbox.”
